PARISH COUNCIL Chairman's Update

The Old Girls School (Kirkgate)

I am pleased to report that Corbyns (Consulting Civil and Structural Engineers) Report on the Building at 18 Kirkgate, Sherburn in Elmet (known as 'The Old Girls School') will shortly be available on the Parish website.

Regretfully the report is far from favorable but having said that, given the age of the building I feel it to be commensurate.

The Parish Council continues to look at the viability of the Parish purchasing the building and would welcome commercially sustainable ideas for the use of the building. Parish funds are limited and raised by precept (part of your Council Tax) the building while hopefully considered as a 'Community Asset' it should be largely self-financing. The caveat being the amount of additional remedial works which will need to be carried out over the next 5 years. In addition, should the building be run in a similar vein to The Eversley Park Centre then the issue of staffing will require to be considered coupled with heating, lighting, insurance and Council Tax etc. the Parish must think carefully about this long term and sizable commitment.

On a more positive note, under the Community Assets and Services Grants as of the 2nd July 2013 it is now possible to apply for a capital grant of up to £500,000. This is in addition to the possibility of a pre-feasibility and feasibility grant. Clearly, this would be a tremendous help and I have requested that our Project Officer begins work on the feasibility grant application.

Parking Enforcement

New rules for enforcing parking regulations.

On the 30th May 2013, responsibility for the enforcement of parking restrictions on the public highways throughout North Yorkshire passed to North Yorkshire County Council.

Civil parking enforcement means that the powers to enforce on-street parking, loading and waiting restrictions are transferred from the police to the local highway authority. Civil parking enforcement is now operational throughout North Yorkshire. There will be no clamping or removal of vehicles.

Enforcement for our Parish will be carried out by the Harrogate Borough Council.

From here on, penalty charges will be standardised across North Yorkshire, bringing them into line with the charges currently imposed in Harrogate and Scarborough. There will be two different levels of penalty:-

1. Parking where waiting, stopping or loading are prohibited will constitute a higher level contravention, with a charge of £70.00.
2. Failure to comply with the requirements in designated parking areas will lead to a charge of £50.00.

(Both penalties will be halved if paid within 14 days.)

Industrial development

There is a planning application (2013/0467/0UT) to develop an area of 40 hectares/90 acres (1.25 million sq ft) to the east of the existing industrial park (opposite the old Cumin Lounge). This would mean more warehousing and manufacturing units at a time when 45% of the existing industrial park is unoccupied. Selby District Council have suggested a future requirement for 5-10 hectares of employment land at Sherburn, so this application is well in excess of that amount.

The Parish Council have concerns that this proposal will detract from the existing industrial park and will also result in some serious traffic issues. The proposed entrance is on a stretch of the B1222 with a poor safety record and the extra traffic will have serious implications for the village centre and the roundabout at the A162/A63 junction in particular. The Parish Council have already put in a lot of work to ensure that these issues are examined in a detailed and fair manner and we will continue to ensure that road safety remains a priority.

Sherburn High School Ofsted Report

'School well placed to improve further'

Staff and students at Sherburn High school were delighted to learn that their school had been graded 'good' for teaching, 'good' for behaviour and safety' and 'good' for leadership and management in the report of their recent Ofsted inspection published this week. Although achievement still 'requires improvement', inspectors recognised



that at both GCSE and A level, attainment is rising and rates of progress accelerating. Head teacher, Martyn Sibley, said 'we were particularly pleased that the inspection team identified all the hard work that has gone into improving the quality of teaching since our last in-

spection in 2011. We believe that this is the critical building block on which will now move the school rapidly to outstanding' He also emphasised inspectors' comments about the positive relationships between students and adults which contribute to a 'very positive climate for learning' as well the school's strong commitment to the development of the 'whole individual'. He further commented that he was very pleased that inspectors had observed how proud students were of their school and that students feel safe in a 'climate of mutual respect'. Mr Sibley added 'it was very encouraging to receive this very positive feedback about the ethos of our school. We strive to create a family atmosphere at Sherburn High School where students feel genuinely cared for as individuals, I think this report captures that'.

Mr Chris Lewis, Chair of Governors, said that the governing body were very encouraged by the narrative of the report and would continue to support and challenge school leaders in the next phase of the school's development. He also added his thanks, on behalf of governors for all the hard work and commitment of both teachers and support staff in the relentless drive to move the school forward.

Japanese Knotweed—JK for short

Background

This article was first printed in the Informer last year but we thought it would be a good idea to reprint it this year with a follow up in the next Informer.

This is an introduction to a plant many people know nothing about, including farmers.

In many ways it is a pretty plant with nice flowers at certain times of the year. However some people who have it growing in their drive or gardens will find every year there are more shoots appearing than last year.



This is the story of Japanese Knotweed [JK for short] and its sinister purpose!!

JK grows underground through a crown or rhizome [underground stem] rather than seeds. It can grow a metre in a month and causes 'heave' under concrete and tarmac then grows through the subsequent cracks. This could happen to your house if it got into the foundations. New shoots appear in March/April, they are reddish/purple with rolled up leaves and can grow as much as 4cm [1 1/2"] in a day. The rhizome can extend at least 2m deep [7ft] and 7m laterally [23ft]. 1cm [1/4"] of rhizome can grow a new plant within 10 days. Cut stems can still regenerate if left with a covering of soil or in very wet conditions. If stems are allowed to dry and get to the orange/brown woody state they are safe. However the rhizome will take much longer to die and can remain dormant for up to 20 years

JK can be spread by fly tipping garden waste containing rhizomes; children playing in a contaminated field can bring bits of rhizome on shoes or by cutting stems down and discarding them away from the area. According to the North Yorkshire Wildlife Officer gardeners can cause spreading by pulling it up and putting

it in the green bin, please do not do this.

It is an offence to plant or grow JK. However landowners who have it on their land need only control it. If they remove or dispose of it incorrectly, thus causing it to spread to other areas then that is illegal and the Police Wildlife Officer should investigate, if they can't take action

a civil case can be brought by the Parish Council or private individuals.

Chemical Control

JK is sensitive to a range of herbicides, these must be applied by a qualified person

and can take up to 3 to 4 years to complete and permission must be gained from the Environment Agency if near a watercourse. Even after this treatment and JK dies back soil removed from site will still contain bits of dormant rhizome.

Physical Control

Cutting can be done if it is not possible to treat mature stems because



of proximity to a water course or spray drift. The effect of cutting in early spring reduces the size of the stems. Stems have to be cut cleanly at the base; this avoids fragments forming more stems. Ideally cutting should be started when the stems first appear in spring and then cut a further three times through the year the last cut just before the plants die back for the winter around September/October, this causes the plant to lose its strength and causes the rhizome to shrink. This method can also take up to 3 to 4 years but doesn't kill the rhizome. The stems should then be thoroughly dry before disposal.

Disposal

Whenever JK is moved from a site, precautions must be taken to ensure there is no spread to other areas.

Contact the Parish Council or Selby District Council to see if they know of or offer a collection service or have a list of sites capable of accepting JK waste.

Controlled burning on site is acceptable providing it does not cause a nuisance to others and protective clothing and visors are worn by workers. Private individuals can burn JK on their land after informing the Selby District Environment Section.

Soil containing JK and burnt remains can be buried on the site it grew but the Government Environment Agency must be informed at least a week before burial. The pit must be at least 5m deep and the material should be covered with a root barrier membrane and with inert fill or topsoil. However although it is approved by the Environment Agency

However the feeling on this method is it is building up trouble for 20 years into the future. Needless to say many householders and farmers do not have the wherewithal to carry out the above. It is safer to

contact North Yorkshire Council or the Central Government Environment Agency details can be found on their respective web sites. If you are not on the 'web' please contact the Parish Council for addresses and 'phone numbers.

We already know some houses have JK in their drive ways so by following the above advice the house owners can avoid the risk if the weed gets into the foundations.

The visiting scheme has been in existence for over 25 years and its aim is still to improve the quality of life of local residents and alleviate loneliness by encouraging clients to participate in our many and varied activities. We are finding it difficult to continue operating our services due to a shortage of volunteers.

At present our regular commitments include:-

- Providing transport to medical appointments locally and to hospitals - drivers needed
- Heating and delivering meals-on-wheels - cooks, drivers and distributors needed (can you spare one and a half hours per month?)
- Running a Monday morning door to door minibus service to Selby and Friday morning to Castleford
- Running a Thursday door to door service using the Sherburn community minibus to transport clients to local shops and assist with bags on the return journey. Some clients are then taken to the Methodist Church for a pre-booked hot lunch which is cooked and served by our volunteers - drivers, cooks and other helpers needed
- Holding a social afternoon at the Lady Popplewell Centre on alternate Tuesdays. A range of activities are offered and refreshments served
- We also organise regular social events which include seaside and other trips, visits to markets and retail outlets, fish and chip lunches and theatre visits. We try to cater for clients of all abilities and hire the local community minibus which has a tail-lift for wheelchairs, as well as using our own 6 seater minibus

New bus service to Xscape

Utopia Coaches will add a Wednesdays-only journey back from Xscape to the 491 timetable from next week, allowing young people to make the most of the activities on offer there. The Sherburn to Castleford service will depart Xscape at 10pm. The family-run coach firm will also allow youth club members to travel at half the adult fare to Xscape. The idea for the evening bus service arose from a survey by youth club leaders of their members. The survey found that a top priority was a bus service to Xscape. A weekly bus would give them the opportunity to visit Xscape and use the wide range of activities. To achieve their goal the youth clubs successfully applied for a grant from the Western Community Engagement Forum of Selby District Council. Local district Councillors Jack Crawford and Andrew Pound then approached Utopia to see what would be possible and how they could get the most from the grant money for these young people. They found that the best idea was to build upon Utopia Coaches' newly introduced Monday to Saturday timetable on their service 491.

Owen said: "The last journey leaves Sherburn at 5.30pm and arrives at Xscape at 6.37pm. That seemed right for the youth clubs needs and so the only extra journey would be a return journey back from Xscape, the new journey at 2200.

"Fares to and from Xscape were the other concern of the youth clubs' members and Utopia offered to help by reducing the fares on the two Wednesday evening journeys. The reduction allows youth club members aged 18 and under to travel at half the adult fare to and from Xscape."

We will also be working with local senior schools this coming year to find the Young Chef of local schools, this project will be taken forward with local butcher Graham Starkey and other people who have expressed interest in helping make this opportunity for young people a great success. The winner of the competition can then go forward to a national award should they wish to do so.

Much of the text above highlights the work of Rotary with communities, we also work with local businesses through facilitating the establishment of a Business Networking meeting which takes place on the first Friday of each month,(except August) this is an open meeting. The first meeting in June heard from Nigel Adams MP, share his work and experience in creating opportunities for local businesses to expand. Local businesses are key to the success of the whole community. If any local business owner is interested in being involved we would be very happy to provide further information.

Rotary is not just for men, the current president and president elect are both women, we have a mixed group, in age, skills and knowledge and experience allowing us to make positive contribution to developing health local communities.



The Growing Patch — by David Mitchell

Doesn't gardening take time – that's if you do it properly? The more crops you grow the longer it takes to get round the garden to do the jobs. Vegetables rely on thorough soil preparation, constant care with weeding, feeding and keeping the birds off. My three rows of strawberries had a layer of chipping put round them at the beginning of the season keeping down weeds and retain moisture. It made a soft bed for the fruit to lie on and prevented soil splash on the fruit. We've managed to keep the slugs and snails at bay with carefully timed slug pellets. Nets can't keep determined birds out. Baby birds in particular are able to get through the small mesh and I am trying very hard to protect those four blueberry bushes.

How do they do it? All that talk of CD's suspended above the vegetable bed is a criterion that with me doesn't work. We try to encourage bird life in the garden but it is frustrating when the complete crop of peas disappears! I blamed it on the pigeons first, then the slugs and then discovered non emergent peas. It appears you have to sow seed for bird feed as well as the crop! Those wee 'blackies' are devils!

Of course the simplest way of gardening is – Yes! – keep it simple. We have a lawn area, 11 X 8 yards lawn at the side of the house overlooked by the bedrooms. A large Magnolia (soulangeana), 35 years old sits in the centre with a bed of blue lavender beneath to match the white lavender strip under the windows. Grass cutting is saved by a strip of tulips on one side and 'bluebells' and 'daffs' on the other. The

sumac (*Rhus typhina*) in the corner shadows the stone seat and extends the interest season with its beautiful autumn colour. Quick to wizz round with the mower, edge up and occasionally pull an offending weed!

I'm already looking into the future when the old bones start to creak and the aches and pains start in. Cut down the work. Keep going with the mulching to reduce weeds. Finesse the composting techniques and make careful selections of shrubs. No herbaceous plants for me and the bedding we'll keep to the absolute minimum. The beech and box hedges need little attention during the season, that's if you catch the new growths early enough with the first cut and keep fertilizers to the minimum.

Trouble is I'm a sucker for a new plant and the market is just teeming with new varieties with Roy Lancaster diving off to China every 5 minutes or the Kirstenbosch Botanic Garden coming up with another exotic. Giving a talk with a Horticultural Society the other evening I went through a visual palate of shrubs and climbers. They were able to tick their matching list of plants. You could tell by the "oo's" and "aah's"; their ball point pens were busy. The red *Hydrangea mycophylla* 'Tellers Red' and *Acer palmatum* 'Osakazuki' looked set for a few orders. Yes, pride in your garden is easily raised; a maelstrom area for ideas and can create plenty of added value when it comes to a house sale! News update from District Councillor Mike Jordan

Selby District Council Housing Trust.

Buying or renting a home, or rather a home we can afford, is becoming a difficult task! There is a huge demand for housing in the district and they have to be near services so people can walk to them, but more importantly they have to be affordable.

Over the past 5 years the whole district has delivered 86 such homes when demand was actually for 400.

What is Selby District Council doing about it?

Well finally they have started a 'Programme for growth' which is a multi-million pound investment. A major part of that is the setting up of a Housing Trust. Such houses will be in a trust separate from Selby District Council giving it more freedom to borrow and invest in housing. It also needs 4 independent Board members (Ordinary Trustees) to help shape its future---get in touch with the council if you are interested in such a role.

The plan is to make a small start to get things rolling and the Trust are presently looking at sites the council owns right across the district to see if any have the potential for homes.

One final fact, there are 1,200 empty properties across the district that could be brought back into use to help deliver more affordable homes. The Trust will be looking at those in some detail.

News update from County Councillor Bob Packham

Thanks to all of those who voted in the May County Council elections, and elected me as the County Councillor for Sherburn and South Milford for the next four years.

We are experiencing difficult times, both nationally and locally. The Chief Executive of the County Council has recently said that in addition to the £92 million the County Council will have saved between 2011 and 2015, it is now expected that the County will be required by the Government to make further savings of £76 million between 2015-2019. This is bound to impact on the County's ability to deliver services, and choices will need to be made about which services will be protected from cuts and which ones won't.

I set down during the election campaign those issues which I will concentrate on during my term of office, these being: making sure we have sufficient school places locally for children to attend their community school; monitoring and reporting damaged road and footways in order to reduce the risk to the public; seeking to improve youth provision, in particular working with the Group trying to re-establish the Friday night youth drop in at Sherburn; and supporting improvements to High School facilities and their opening up for community use.

I will also be working with the Selby Rail Users Group and others to try to improve public transport provision in our area and to address the road safety and traffic issues resulting from additional development which is taking place without regard to the fact that the roads serving our communities are already inadequate for the traffic using them.

Your support, both by working with me in the community to achieve these aims and by ensuring that I am aware of problems as they arise would be greatly appreciated. We may not be able to address every issue to the satisfaction of every resident but that is no reason not to try to achieve the most we can for our community.

In relation to youth provision, I am particularly keen to ensure that the Friday night drop in at the Eversley Park centre is maintained. A group of residents is looking at ways to employ trained youth workers to support community volunteers, and we have had discussions with the County Council and the Chair of the Community Engagement Forum on this subject. We are confident that professional help can be found and financed, but more volunteers are needed. Please contact me if you are interested in volunteering and/or would like to be part of the Group working towards re-establishing the drop in this Autumn.

Kingspan Protecting our Wildlife

One of the things that makes the UK such a great place to live is our beautiful countryside. Sadly many of our native plants and wildlife are under threat from urban development, invasion of foreign species and the effects of a changing climate, so it is up to us to protect it as much as we can.

With this in mind, Kingspan Insulation started a programme of work on the Pembridge site back in 2006, and has now introduced a plan to protect and enhance biodiversity at the Selby site. Far from being a barren manufacturing site as some might think, the surroundings can provide a thriving habitat for a large number of species of plants, birds and bats.

The first project took place on the 23rd and 24th April this year, and involved 58 pupils from local schools who came along to learn about the environment and to get stuck in. Children in year 3 from Sherburn Hungate Community Primary School, and years 4 and 5 from Athelstan Primary helped to build 'bug hotels' out of old pallets, straw, bricks and bits of wood, as well as planting wild flowers to attract bees and creating a

bumble bee bank. Bernadette Lobo, principal Ecologist at Lobo Ecology, helped to supervise the work,

Not only did the project help to improve the site, it also taught the children about the importance of protecting our wildlife, and the fun that could be had doing it, working together, building things and getting their



hands dirty. Hopefully this is just the first of many projects with local schools, helping children to get

switched on to the natural environment.
