There are lots of exciting WEA classes coming up this Autumn in the Sherburn and Tadcaster area for you to try.

WEA is a registered charity that has been helping adults to learn since 1903.

### SELBY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS UPDATE

There is a lot of activity in Sherburn these days.

Between us we are working together and with the Parish

Council to keep on top of the issues where combined action can achieve better results.

We were all opposed to the District Council's proposals to develop half of the greenspace at Highfields, upon which none of us were consulted in advance. Dave's actions in co-ordinating the local response and informing the Leader of the Council of the Community's objections has resulted in the withdrawal of the proposal, although we do expect a reduced scheme (possibly three bungalows) to come forward and will ensure the community is consulted. We are currently resisting major development at Gascoigne Wood, including 43 hectares (106 acres) of mainly good quality, agricultural land. We oppose the development on a number of grounds, including the loss of the agricultural land, the massive increases in traffic expected and the resultant increases in commuting and the fact that most of the workers (about 93%) on the current Enterprise Park live outside Selby District. The Gascoigne Wood development would be likely to continue this trend. We don't oppose employment development, but we want to see **well paid jobs for local residents** as the priority.

We are pleased to see that the ginnels in Beechwoods/Eversley Mount are finally being cleared and resurfaced. We have been working on this for at least 18 months and have finally got the Council to do what was needed. Thanks also to the workers in Community Payback organisation who carried out the initial clearance of vegetation.

Finally, we want to say what a wonderful event the Craft and Food Festival is for Sherburn. Thanks to all those volunteers who organised, set up, and ran this event. It shows again that more can be achieved by volunteering and providing services and leisure pursuits for residents than by constantly criticising the efforts of others. # healthwatch North Yorkshire

## Giving you a voice on local health and social care services

North Yorkshire is a huge county, and people in communities like Sherburn can face particular challenges in accessing health and social care.

What not everyone knows is that they have an independent champion - Healthwatch North Yorkshire, which exists to make sure that people are at the heart of care.

Healthwatch North Yorkshire listens to what people like about services and what could be improved, sharing those views with people with the power to make change happen. Staff and volunteers also help people find the information they need about services and support in their area, whether it is provided by the NHS, councils or the voluntary and charity sectors.

The Healthwatch team are on hand to support users of local services on the phone, email and through their website. They are also frequently on the road across the county at events and markets to talk to members of the community.

The team are available to meet groups and appear at events to talk about their work and tell people how they can get involved, including a range of volunteering opportunities such as observing local services, supporting outreach work and at a strategic level.



## Spotlight on Sherburn White Rose Sports & Social Club

Sherburn White Rose Sports & Social Club is based at the recreation ground on Finkle Hill, just passed the police station travelling towards Tadcaster. The sports club is the home to several sports including football, tennis, bowls and netball, the club's facilities include a 130 people capacity clubhouse, has 4 changing rooms, including two referees changing rooms, bowls room, two full size football pitches one of which is floodlit, bowling green, two floodlit tennis courts, floodlit single netball court and a play area for under 10-year olds.

As some people are aware the sports club previously outgrew the old pavilion built in the 60's, when the junior section of the football club was set up in 1994, very quickly establishing 10 junior teams and 3 senior teams. Following the growth in football a new clubhouse was re-built in 2004 with partnership funding from the football club, football foundation, coalfields regeneration trust and Selby district council.

The sports club committee are central to the running of the club and are representative of all the sports who oversee the smooth running of the club in an efficient and sustainable way for our community users, whether it's for sport or social activities. The committee is supported by a newly appointed centre manager who oversees the running of the club working with volunteers to organise music and comedy evenings, bingo nights and events including the annual bonfire night, football tournaments, Ascot Race Day and many other events, this year's bonfire night will be held on Fri 1<sup>st</sup> Nov, this is free to all and includes a firework display, bar, food and other attractions.

The Sports Club is open to all, with registered members receiving discounted drinks from the bar that offers a selection of traditional and guest beers and lagers, the club also offers Sky and BT Sports with viewing from several TV's, and includes a pool table, dart board and free WIFI. The club has a very friendly atmosphere and welcomes families, opening times are Tues, Weds, Thurs and Fri evenings and all-day Sat & Sun.

**Football Club** Sherburn White Rose are an FA Charter Standard Football Club and has been in existence since 1947 the club currently hosts 18 football teams and is the largest club within Selby District, teams range from juniors at under 5s up to under 21s, two senior teams, a veteran's team and a newly established ladies' team. Players of all abilities are welcome at the club and are offered quality coaching sessions through fully qualified volunteer coaches, and all teams and the club are supported by an army of volunteers who support the ethos of the club to develop and improve players development in a fun and enjoyable way. All coaches are qualified between FA Level One and UEFA B and most coaches also hold FA Youth Module badges meaning that all children who partake in coaching sessions, do so in the knowledge that they are working with highly skilled and qualified coaches who are keen to develop both footballing and life skills.

Juniors train mainly on Friday evenings at the club in the summer evenings and at the impressive 3G artificial pitch at the High School in the winter, the club also use the Artificial pitch at the Fairways and play matches on Sundays at the club and Hungate Primary School. Seniors train on Tues and Thurs evenings and play on Saturday afternoons, Veterans play on a Sunday Afternoon.
